

Moving blogs from titania to wp

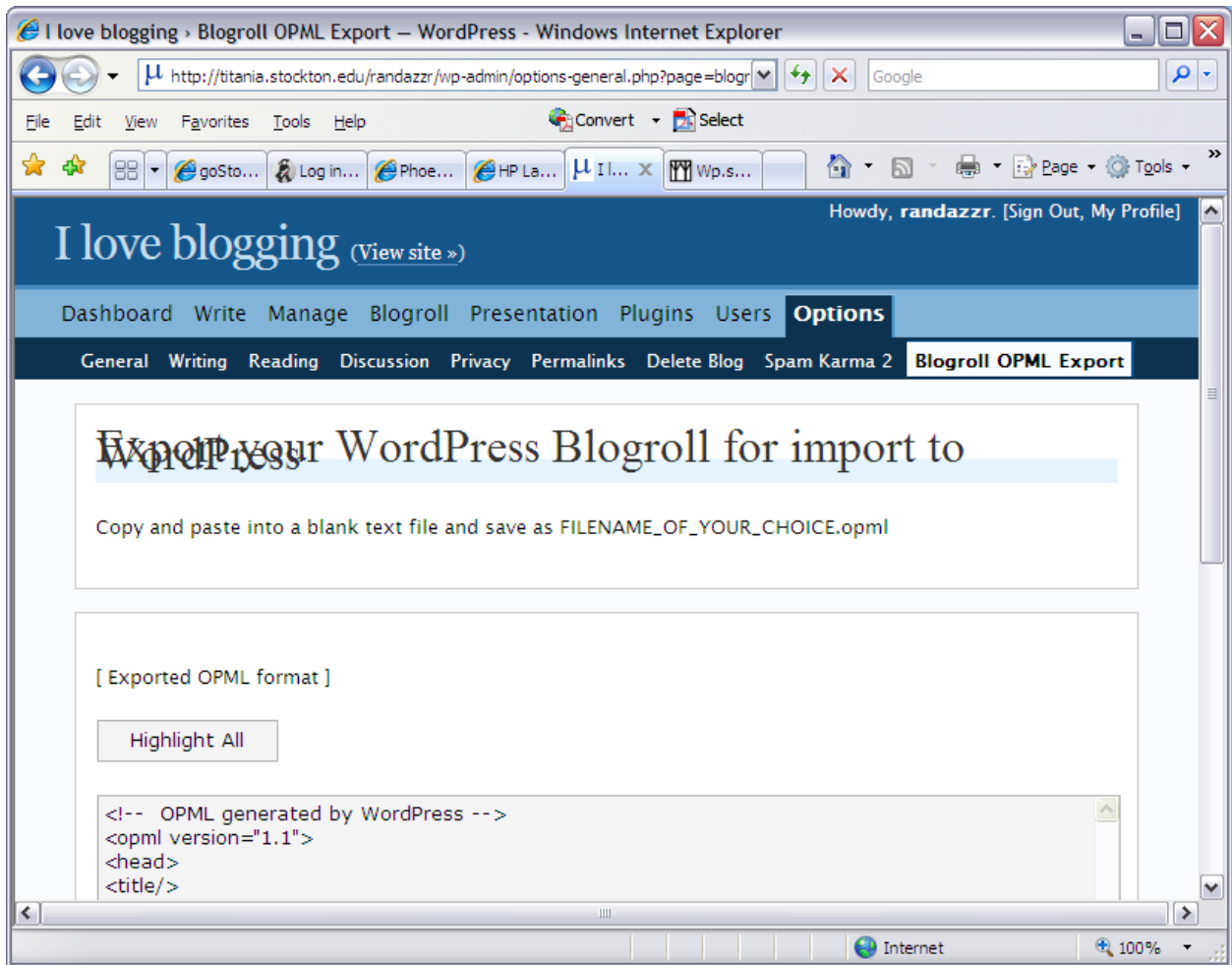
Login to your blog on titania as normal

Click on manage, then click on export



Click on the download export, a dialog box will appear asking you to open or save the file, select save. Note where you save the file, you will need it later.

To move your blogroll, click on options, then Blogroll OPML export

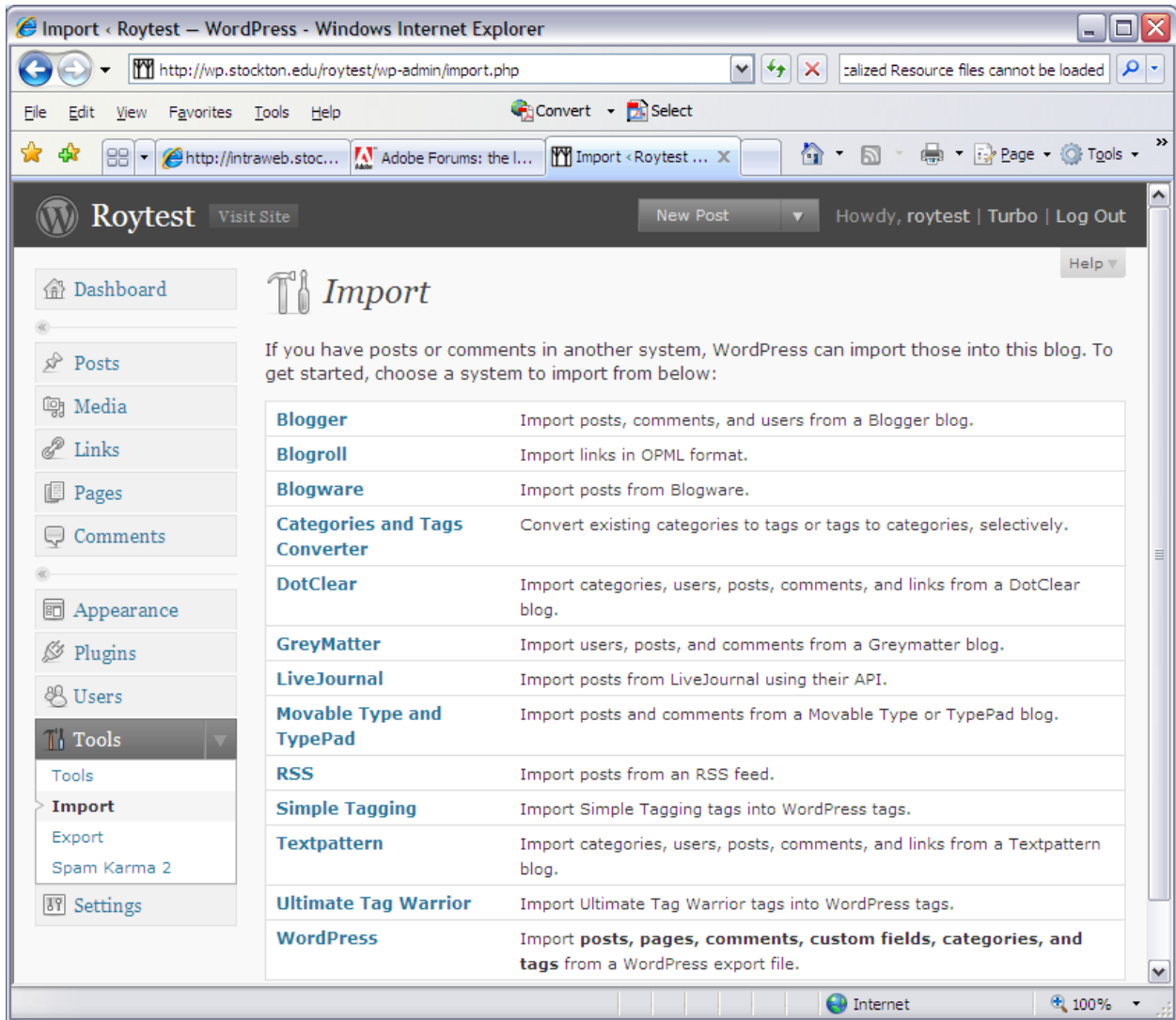


Click on the highlight all button, then right click on the highlighted text and click copy.

Open up notepad, or a comparable text editor (not Microsoft word), click on edit, and click on paste.

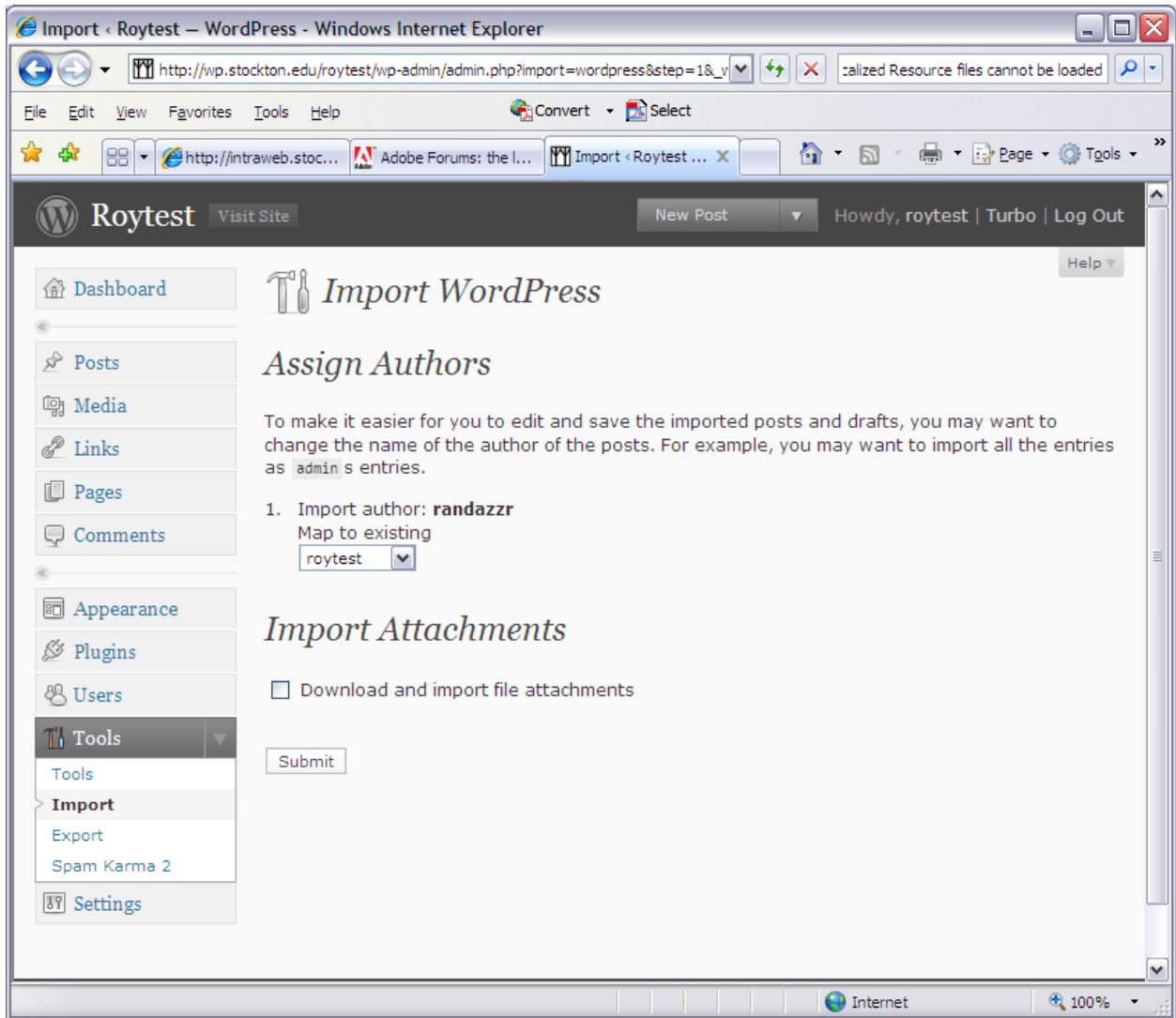
Save the file as whatever.opml (whatever can be anything, but it must end in .opml)

Next create an account and a blog on wp.stockton.edu, and then go to site admin, then options, then import, and click wordpress

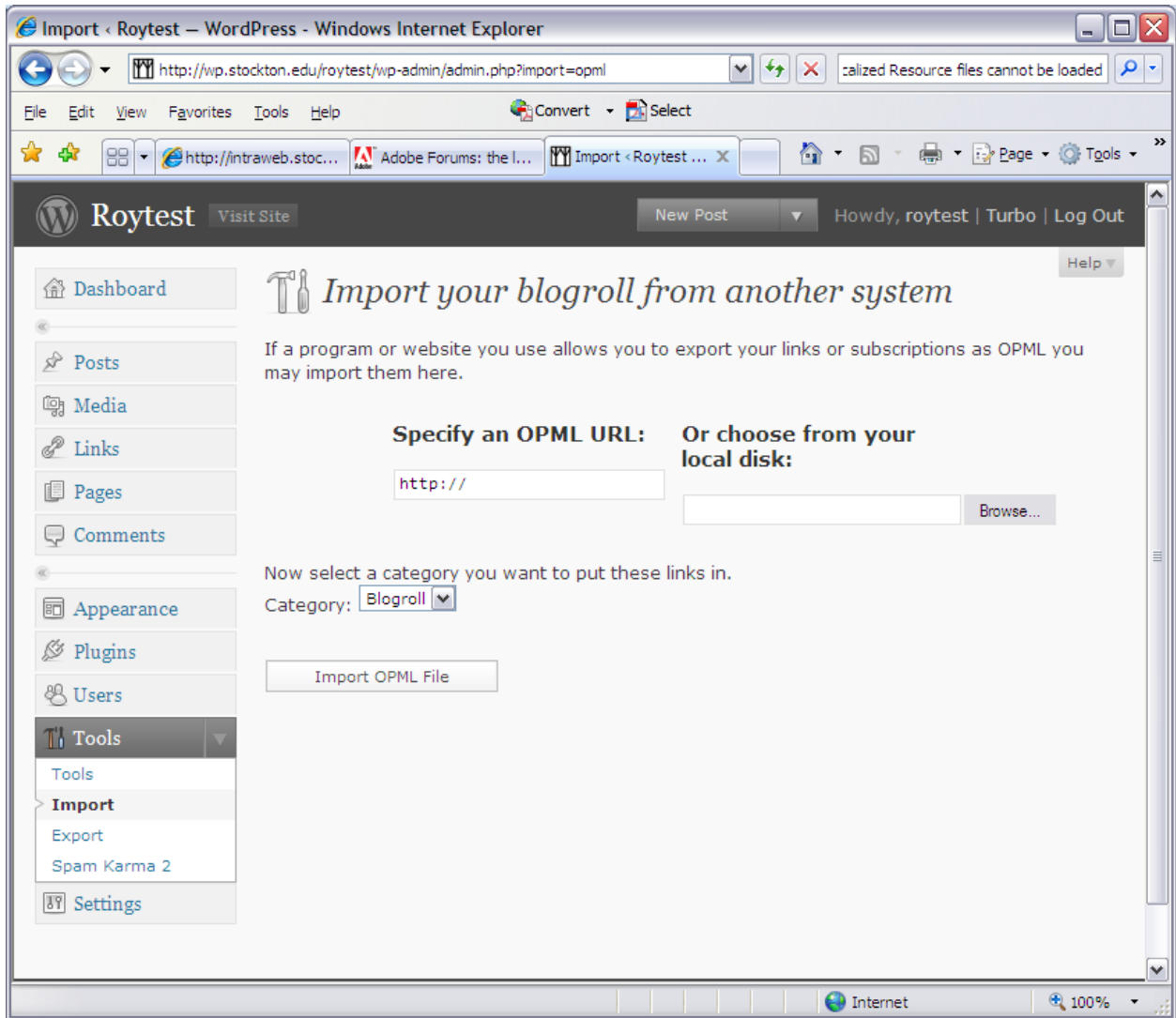


Next, click browse, select the file you exported from titania earlier (not the blogroll file), and click upload file and import

You may get a screen asking to map posts to a different user (shown below). This happens if the users from your old blog do not have an account. Map them to your account. Also, select download and import attachments if you want them to be available.



Once this is done, click import again, and this time click blogroll. Click the browse button under “or choose from your local disk”, and select the opml file you exported from titania earlier.



Once it says all done, you should be fully migrated to the new wp server.
